David Wilson, 41, of Lexington, was taken into custody and charged with three counts of wanton endangerment, possession of a handgun by a convicted felon and possession of marijuana.

Wilson was outside a Ready Mix plant when police were called to the scene. Wilson pointed a gun at the first officer to arrived, then spent more than an hour pacing back and forth before police were able to subdue him. He was arrested after police persuaded him to lay down his gun.

LEXINGTON (AP) — The president of Comair sent a letter to the city of Lexington on Friday, thanking residents for their support in the year following a plane crash that killed 49 people.

Don Bornhorst's letter, addressed to Mayor Jim Newberry and the Lexington community, said the city "continues to bear the burden of such a tragedy occurring in your tight-knit communi-

The letter acknowledged the loss to family and friends of those who died and said "Comair employees also mourn the lost members of our family."

Comair Flight 5191 crashed early last Aug. 27 after taking off from the wrong runway at Lexington's Blue Grass Airport. First Officer James Polehinke was the only survivor.

A public ceremony was planned for today in Lexington to mark the first anniversary.
